Jonathan also ministers and serves alongside his father Pastor Tony Evans in Dallas, Texas.

Both these men of God gave excellent messages focusing on unity among the believers and the need to share the gospel both locally and globally even during a pandemic. Pastor Lepine spoke on the passage in Ephesians 4 regarding unity in the body of Christ. He stressed the need for believers to treat each other and those they serve in ministry with dignity, civility and humility. Jonathan Evans' message was based on Genesis 6:14 when God instructed Noah to build an ark of gopher wood, make rooms in it and coat it with pitch inside and out. He pointed out that the gopher wood used to build the ark was able to withstand the battering of the flood and winds against the ark and how God kept those inside the ark safe. The rooms in the ark were prepared specifically for anyone who heeded the warning and decided to come into the ark for safety. The ark represents Jesus, who still has power to save even during a pandemic and the "pitch" used for the ark represents Christ's atoning work. We always need to remember that we have the words of hope for a dying and lost world and can point people to Christ, especially since so many people are dying daily from the virus during this pandemic. This really resonated with me and challenged me to use every opportunity to share this message of hope with others.

Other featured events during the conference were a live presentation of an achievement award to a missionary couple who has served in ministry for many years in Africa, and a panel discussion of local pastors which focused on and answered questions regarding the challenges of presenting the gospel amidst racial tensions and relations within the churches and our communities today. We also had a live chat room



to ask questions or make comments during the conference and there was a live drawing for a prize awarded to one of the registered attendees toward a future GOGF mission trip in 2021.

The attendance (over sixty) was one of the largest in the history of the conference. May the Lord be praised for the blessing we received from this year's conference and may we heed God's call to "Go and make disciples...." ∻

We went up to the beautiful Refreshing Mountains Retreat and Adventure Center in Lancaster, PA October 16-18. Our speaker for the weekend was none other than Pastor Thomas A. Troutt, Sr. – lead pastor of Philadelphia Bible Fellowship, a sister assembly out in the northeast Philadelphia area. Pastor Troutt's messages centered around our retreat theme "A Real God for an Impossible World." He started off by giving us a 'heart check' by asking three questions:

- 1. Do I have the heart to wait on God?
- 2. Do I have a heart to want what God wants?
- 3. Do I have the heart to be a true worshipper?

Pastor Tom continued throughout the weekend emphasizing that when we have a heart for God, He will take us through impossible situations. He encapsulated the theme of the weekend with his final message; when God puts us through the impossible, it's so we can depend on Him.

WHOM DO I CONTACT?

And when we're doing work for God, there are three stages God will bring us through: **IMPOSSIBLE**, **DIFFICULT and DONE**. This resonated with us as a ministry because we went through those exact stages while planning this retreat, and we all consider it done because of Jesus.

The retreat schedule was young adult centered with varied activities including prayer walk devotions. Another feature was a Saturday evening communion campfire. This was a moving service as many young adults were able to have space and freedom to speak on whatever the Lord laid on their hearts. Data from the online survey to retreat attendees revealed that among the target age demographic, 100% would definitely recommend the GCA Young Adult Retreat. The Young Adult Ministry has a heart of gratitude for all the support we received from our church family and for all the people that were willing to join us that weekend. Watch any negative self-talk and counter it with affirming words from the Scriptures. Surround yourself with people who will listen to you and build you up. Ensure you are getting enough rest and adequate sleep. Exercise regularly and eat nutritiously.

Spend time outdoors; engage in your favorite hobbies; watch good movies (including comedies). Laughter is therapeutic. Be kind to others. Maintain a gratitude journal. Know that there is hope. Protecting your mental health is one of the best things you can do to help you live an abundant and productive life. \diamond
