For Your *Health* By Margaret Aitcheson

Hydration is the process of drinking enough fluids to ensure that all the bodily functions can take place normally. Our bodies depend on water to survive as it makes up more than half of the body weight and every cell, organ and tissue in the body needs water to work properly. Water is best for staying hydrated but other drinks such as fruits and vegetable juices, milk, soups, broth and herbal teas can help also.



Proper hydration can also improve mood, boost brain function, prevent fatigue, keep skin moisturized and prevent constipation. If you don't drink enough fluids you will become dehydrated and your body will not be able to function properly. Signs of dehydration include passing little or no urine; dark yellow or amber colored urine; thirst, headache, dizziness, confusion, fatigue and heat stroke.

Water is lost from the body in sweat (especially in hot weather), urine, stools and even from the breath, so it needs to be replaced.

Everyone has different hydration needs. An easy rule is to divide your body weight in half and drink that amount in ounces. (e.g.: weight 160 pounds \div 2 = 80 pounds. Amount of water to drink daily = 80 ounces). If you have heart failure or kidney disease check with your doctor.

Keep a reusable water bottle with water with you to drink from throughout the day. Add a little lemon juice if you like. Drink water when you wake up, at each meal and before bedtime. This will ensure your body functions well and will go a long way in helping you maintain good health. \diamond
