

INTERNATIONAL CHRISTIAN HIGH SCHOOL By Nicolas Grant

Within weeks of preaching my first message at GCA, I received a call from the principal of the high school I graduated from, International Christian High School (ICHS). Word had gotten back to him that I had spoken at GCA and he was now inviting me to give a word to the ICHS students during chapel service.

I won't deny it, my internal response was 100% "NO", because I was fearful and still felt inexperienced (after all I had only given 1 sermon ever). I didn't feel qualified to do what he was asking. So, I replied, "Well I have only spoken in that capacity one time" and then he replied, "That's fine, one time is all you need to do it again." I got a good laugh, but somehow that put me at ease. In those brief seconds God had reminded me that I don't need to worry so much and that He would be right there with me. As the principal, Mr. Brittin, and I continued to talk, I realized this random phone call wasn't just a coincidence; it was a response to some of the youth items my wife and I had been praying about. Mr. Brittin shared that a major desire of the school administration was that ICHS students without a "home church" be able to connect with a local church and youth group that could become their own. As an ICHS alumni, they hoped that I might be able to make a connection.

On December 16th I gave a message to 150 students titled, "Being A Superhero for God." Using superheroes like Spider-Man, Iron Man, and Batman, I discussed the available resources that

made each character special and how God has given us all access to resources to help us grow and live lives beyond our expectations. Because of the topic, the students were extremely vocal at times and very engaged. It was a lively environment.

After I shared the Word, I did a brief presentation on the GCA teen ministry and invited them to Bible study and future events. I must say, I was blown away by the response as several students expressed interest and made sure they gave Rita and me their contact information, while others joined our social media page. ICHS has been very excited over the response and even the parents association has gotten involved to make sure students are able to stay after school and safely get transported to Bible study at GCA. This is key as most student families do not have transportation.

Our teen Bible studies began on January 31st and included a shuttle from ICHS to GCA. We are also hosting a dodgeball tournament at ICHS at 6 p.m. on Friday, February 18th with teens from ICHS, GCA, and others we are inviting from the area who would like to join us.

ICHS has shared there are other needs such as mentors who could visit the school once a week to help disciple new Christians. They also need people available to do activities with students after school (such as chess, knitting, wood works, etc.). A significant portion of the students are unsaved and ICHS uses these relationships to share the Gospel and strengthen their faith in God. Many students are not eager to go home after school, so having other options keeps them in a positive environment during unsupervised hours.

Things have been moving at a fast pace so my wife and I, as well as our youth team covet your prayers as we look for wisdom in growing this ministry. If you are willing to get involved, please contact Rita Grant. \diamond



This year we can make healthy choices which can become lifelong habits that can impact our lives for good. Some of these are:

Exercising at least 30 minutes a day by running, walking, dancing or going to the gym. Spend some time outdoors. Incorporate weight or resistance training which will strengthen the muscles and increase bone density preventing osteoporosis.

Drink about 2 liters of water daily unless prevented by health issues. Sleep at least 7-8 hours daily.

Get checkups as directed by your doctor, dentist and eye doctor to discover any hidden health issues.

Develop healthy relationships which will improve mental and emotional health. Spend quality time with family and loved ones.

Take care of excess stress and chronic stress which can lead to difficulty sleeping, depression and lifethreatening diseases. Find healthy ways to relax. Talk about your stress issues with trusted friends, counselors, or your doctor.

Stimulate your mind by reading books, doing puzzles and learning new things.

Meditate daily on the Scriptures, pray, express gratitude to God and others. Listen to relaxing music.

These are some surefire ways to take care of ourselves-our temples-to bring honor to God. \diamond


