

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Health is defined as a state of complete physical, mental, and social well-being and not just the absence of disease or infirmity. It is important to make wise choices to be healthy, to stay healthy, and not take our health for granted.

1 Corinthians 6:19-20 states that our body is God's temple and so we should honor God in our body. Choosing a healthy lifestyle is one way to honor God and carry out His purpose for us. It is quite challenging to operate at our best if we are not keeping good health.

Maintaining good health requires a balanced approach that incorporates choices that promote physical, mental, spiritual and emotional wellbeing.

Here are some key practices:

1. Have a balanced diet with fruits, vegetables, whole grains, lean protein, healthy fats, and controlled portion size. Stay hydrated, having about 8 cups of water daily.

2. Stay active, exercise regularly and incorporate strength training.

3. Get adequate sleep. 7-8 hours per night.

4. Manage stress, stay connected to family and friends and seek help when needed. Remember, we can cast all our cares on the Lord because He cares for us (1 Peter 5:7)

5. Make preventive health care a priority. Get regular screening for common conditions such as high blood pressure, diabetes, high cholesterol, heart disease and cancer.

6. Avoid harmful habits such as excessive alcohol intake, smoking, and caffeine consumption.

7. Stay positive. Practice being grateful; engage in enjoyable activities.

8. Make daily Bible reading, prayer, meditation and drawing close to the Lord a priority.

By following these practices consistently, you can maintain good health and improve your quality of life. \diamond
