- Did you know that a male is called a wizard, and that both witches and wizards were ordered executed under Old Testament laws, and that both are abominations in the sight of God? (See Deut. 18:10-12 and Lev. 20:27.)
- Did you know that in the public school system our children are not permitted to celebrate the birth or resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, but they are assigned parts in the celebration of HALLOWEEN, a celebration of witchcraft and demonism?
- 10. Did you know that in recent years Satan has influenced HALLOWEEN participants to attempt to harm or destroy our children? (Example: lacing candies with cyanide, and hiding razor blades and needles in cookies, etc.)
- 11. Did you know that when you participate in celebrating HALLOWEEN you are literally joining with many spiritually blind people in paying homage and honor to "his majesty" the Devil?
- 12. Did you know that Christians could make a difference in our society by:
 - 1. Having nothing to do with the preparation or celebration of this unchristian event called HALLOWEEN.
 - 2. Carefully explaining to our children the dangers of HALLOWEEN.
 - Keeping our children from participating in any form of HALLOWEEN celebrations.
 - 4. Involving our children in a clean, Christian function, preferably held within the precincts of a church.
 - 5. Handing suitable Gospel tracts to people who knock at our doors and
 - Explaining to our friends and neighbors why we do not believe in HALLOWEEN.

"We wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places. Wherefore, take unto you the whole armor of God…" Ephesians 6:12, 13. ♦

THINGS EVERYONE SHOULD KNOW ABOUT HALLOWEEN

- 1. **Did you know** that the term "Halloween" represents an unholy alliance between the church and the devil?
 - **a. Did you know** that its name means "hallowed or holy evening" because it takes place the day before "All Saints Day?"
 - b. Did you know that HALLOWEEN is an old pagan festival that has its roots in Druidic beliefs? "The Druids, an order of priests in ancient Gaul and Britain, believed that on Halloween, ghosts, spirits, fairies, witches and elves came out to harm people. They thought the cat was sacred and believed that cats had once been human beings but were changed as a punishment for evil deeds." [Taken from the 50th Anniversary Edition of the World Book Encyclopedia.]
 - **c. Did you know** that the Druids celebrated their autumn festival on Oct. 31st?
 - **d. Did you know** that All Saints' Day was instituted by the Roman Catholic Church and was first celebrated on May 13th? According to the World Book Encyclopedia, the day was changed in the 700's by the Roman Catholic Church to November 1st?
 - **e. Did you know** that from that time, "the old pagan customs and the [so-called] Christian feast day were combined into the Halloween festival?"
- 2. **Did you know** that the way HALLOWEEN is celebrated in these modern times is still directly associated with witches, wizards, witchcraft, Satanism and other demonic practices which the Bible clearly denounces? (Deut.18:10-12)
- 3. **Did you know** that there is a connection between witchcraft and sorcery (having to do with drugs), and that both of these evil practices are condemned in the Bible?
- 4. **Did you know** that our generation is witnessing a revival in the occult and that this revival is based in many colleges and universities across our land?
- 5. **Did you know** that through the year, witchcraft celebrated eight major festivals of which HALLOWEEN, October 31, is the chief?
- **6. Did you know** that there was a time in history when people were burned at the stake for their involvement in witchcraft?
- 7. **Did you know** that the Bible clearly states, "Let no one be found among you who sacrifices his son or daughter in the fire, who practices divination or sorcery, interprets omens, engages in witchcraft or casts spells, or who is a medium or spirits or who consults the dead. Anyone who does these things is detestable ("an abomination"-KJV) to the Lord." Deut 18:10-12 (NIV) (Read also Lev. 19:31; 20:27; Exod. 22:18; Gal. 5:19-20.)

On September 21st, Dr. Darryl Brown, the newly appointed Sunday school director, presented a strategic plan to revitalize and unify the GCA Sunday School program. The short-term focus will be on implementing a scripture-based curriculum for adult and teen classes, while the long-term vision includes a church-wide curriculum tailored by

age group, structured teacher training, and performance reviews to ensure quality and engagement. The plan seeks to align GCA's Biblebased instruction under a unified framework and to cultivate excellence among Sunday School teachers.

The next key steps include selecting a new curriculum; hosting a kickoff breakfast on October 5 to introduce the vision and teaching materials; commencing the Fall 2025 season of Adult and Teen Sunday School classes on October 12; and launching an anonymous attendee survey on Monday, December 15th. ❖
